Like always, I'm grateful to have had the opportunity to talk to Mrs Dayanara, one of the many cogs that help the wheel that is our school work rhythmically.



Women's History Month: Jessica U. Meir

Jessica U. Meir, born July 1, 1977 is a first born American astronaut from Swedish and Israeli heritage who was selected by NASA in 2013.

She holds a bachelor of arts in Biology from Brown University, a master of science in Space Studies from the international Space University and a Doctorate in Marine Biology from Scripps Institution of



Oceanography. She was raised in Caribou, Maine and loved cycling, skiing, hiking, running, soccer and SCUBA diving. She is a private pilot and is fluent in conversational Swedish and Spanish. She has gained several awards and has done groundbreaking research in the fields of biology, earth science, human research etc.

Along with Christina Koch she conducted the first three all-female spacewalks in 2019, totaling 21 hours and 44 minutes. She has spent a total of 204 days 15 hours and 19 minutes in space during her career. In 2024 NASA plans to go back to the moon and Jessica and Christina are candidates to become the first woman to ever walk on the moon.

Some historians believe that April Fool's goes back to 1582 when France switched from using the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar. In the Julian calendar as in the Hindu calendar, the new year began around April 1st from the Spring Equinox. Back then before people had cell phones or the internet to get information quickly; the people were slow to hear the news or did not know about the news that the new year had moved to January 1st. These people continued to celebrate New Year's during the last week of March and began having pranks played on them. The pranks consisted of having paper fish on their backs and being referred to as "poisson d'avril" also known as April fish. The April fish supposedly symbolizes a young, easily caught fish and a gullible person.

April Fool's Day spread through Britain during the 18th century. For example, in Scotland the tradition became a two-day event. It started with "hunting the gowk" and then it was followed by "Tailie Day" which was playing pranks on people's behinds. Such as pinning fake tails on them or placing "kick me" signs on them.

Now that you know more about the origins of April Fool's Day, you understand why we celebrate April Fool's Day and how celebration came to be.

Even some senators were taken in, and the National Park Service even held a press conference to deny the news. At noon, the fast-food chain admitted the joke and said it was donating \$50,000 for the landmark bell's care. The value of the joke, of course, was priceless.
























Editor's Comments
